This minor is for students looking to learn more about the environment, how it is measured and managed, and how people and society interact with it. Applications of this minor include environmental law enforcement, eco-tourism, agriculture education, and environmental policy careers. Courses in the minor may count toward related NYS Civil Service exams. Depending on course selection, there may be course fees.

- · Measure and analyze natural populations.
- · Interpret laws and policies that apply to natural resources.
